Maryland Fairgrounds Information:

The Exhibition Hall is located next to the Horse Show Ring.

From Interstate 83

Take Exit 16A, Timonium Road, East toward Fairgrounds. Cross over the Light Rail tracks to the Fairgrounds entrance on the left. Continue on the Fairgrounds past the Horse Stables and Grandstand on your right and the Administration Building on your left. The Exhibition Hall is between the Administration Building and the Horse Show Ring.

From Interstate 83

Take Exit 17, Padonia Road, East to York Road, continue South on York Road to the Fairgrounds entrance on the right at the Light (North Gate). Continue past the 4-H/Home Arts Building on your right. The Exhibition Hall will be straight ahead and left of the Horse Show Ring.

Rules and Guidelines for Participants of MAAFS Judging School

Purpose

To train and qualify indoor exhibit judges for local fairs and shows.

Objectives

- 1. To provide training, using specific criteria, to perform critical analysis that will bring about uniformity and consistency in judging indoor exhibits.
- 2. To provide training and affirm competence for perspective judges consisting of an Association approved curriculum.
- 3. To develop a pool of qualified judges.

Levels of Judges

Novice: In the process of completing program requirements in the prescribed curriculum. Qualified: Having successfully completed judges' training and field experience.

Instructor: Qualified judge who has completed instructor training and conducted one or more judging school classes.

Steps to Attain Qualification

- 1. Attend judges' training schools.
- 2. Complete three segments in the same subject area by different instructors. Example ~ 3 separate classes of crafts with different instructors.
- 3. Provide written permission to be placed on a judges list that is made public.
- 4. Judge at a minimum of 2 fairs or shows with another judge. (You should not judge alone)
- 5. Provide documentation to MAAFS Judging School of the dates judged.

Until all five steps have been completed you will be considered a Novice judge.

Steps to Retain Oualification

During a two-year period:

- 1. Judge at a minimum of 2 fairs or shows and provide documentation to MAAFS Judging School.
- 2. Attend at least 1 class in the qualified subject matter at a MAAFS Judging School.

Recognition

Participant will receive a subject area pin following the receipt of documentation. A form will be provided by Judging School coordinators.

Re-certification

If you do not attend within a 2 year period, you must take 3 refresher classes in each category that you are qualified to judge in.

Responsibility

- 1. Keep a notebook of handouts from each instructor as a future reference.
- 2. Keep a list of the classes you have taken.

Timeline for Judging School

Spring~ before fairs and shows begin ~ Saturday

Fall ~ after fairs and shows are over ~ Saturday

Why you should not judge at your own fair

It is recommended that you do not use your own judges, due to a conflict of interest.
